City Policy regarding use of public outdoor space through March 31, 2021.

During COVID emergency, until March 31, 2021, when ABCC guidelines are set to expire, the following Guidelines for Sidewalk Seating on City property shall be in effect, subject to any Emergency Orders of the Governor:

- 1) All orange barriers will be removed, no later than November 2nd.
- After the current barriers are removed, all tables may only be placed against the facade of the business.
- 3) A separation between tables of 8' minimum is required.
- 4) A minimum clear pedestrian path of 60" adjacent to the outdoor seating is required.
- 5) Tables & chairs must not block any entrance or ADA accessible areas
- 6) If alcohol is served, with a valid Alcoholic Board Control Commission permit, a barrier must be in place adjacent to the table on sidewalk side of the table to separate the table from the pedestrian walkway.
- 7) Tents or canopies, without sides, may be used on City property, if approved in advance by the City Code Enforcement Officer and/or City Manager.
- 8) The City Code Enforcement Officer will be responsible for monitoring and assuring compliance, and reporting findings to the Mayor and Commissioners.
- 9) Exceptions, upon the demonstration of need or hardship, may be granted, in writing, by the City Code Enforcement Officer and/or City Manager.

City Policy regarding use of heating equipment in public outdoor space through March 31, 2021.

During COVID emergency, until March 31, 2021, when ABCC guidelines are set to expire, the following Guidelines for the use of heating equipment on City property shall be in effect, subject to any Emergency Orders of the Governor:

- 1) Only heaters with propane fuel are permitted
- 2) No electric heaters or open flame heaters are permitted
- 3) Heaters must be securely placed or weighted in such a way that the heater will not be affected by winds.
- 4) Heaters may only be in place during operating hours
- 5) Heaters must not block any entrance or ADA accessible areas
- 6) A minimum clear pedestrian path of 60" adjacent to, and 36" throughout, the outdoor seating is required.
- 7) Heaters must be 60" feet from exits and entrances.
- 8) The City Code Enforcement Officer will be responsible for monitoring and assuring compliance, and reporting findings to the Mayor and Commissioners.
- Exceptions, upon the demonstration of need or hardship, may be granted, in writing, by the City Code Enforcement Officer and/or City Manager.
