

**ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS**

Sealed bids will be received by the City of Rehoboth Beach for the City of Rehoboth Beach Ocean Outfall, City Project #2017-001.

Electronic copies of the contract documents will be received by firms that have been prequalified per the City of Rehoboth REQUEST FOR PREQUALIFICATION NO. 16-001 and hard copies are also available for purchase by pre-qualified firms, for a cost of \$125.00, by contacting Sharon Lynn, City Manager by email at: [slynn@cityofrehoboth.com](mailto:slynn@cityofrehoboth.com). Purchased documents will be mailed to the prospective bidder.

The Work generally consists of constructing, complete with all equipment and accessories, approximately 6,000 linear feet of ocean outfall pipe and a diffuser assembly in Rehoboth Beach, Delaware. A minimum of 3,000 linear feet of the outfall pipeline is proposed for installation via horizontal directional drilling including shore landing and 3,000 linear feet via marine open-cut trench. The proposed staging area is near the north end of the City at Deauville Beach.


Sealed bids will be received by the City of Rehoboth Beach until **2:00 p.m., local time, on Tuesday, July 11, 2017**, in the City Manager's Office located in the City Hall Modular Unit, at 229 Rehoboth Avenue. Bids will be opened on the same day at approximately 2:30 p.m at 219 Rehoboth Avenue, Rehoboth Beach Volunteer Fire Department, on the 2nd floor. Only bids from firms that have been prequalified per the City of Rehoboth REQUEST FOR PREQUALIFICATION NO. 16-001 will be accepted to bid on the Project. Bids from firms who have not been prequalified will not be considered. **A non-mandatory pre-bid meeting** will be held at the Rehoboth Beach Volunteer Fire Department, on the 2nd floor at **10:00 a.m., Thursday, June 15, 2017**.

The project will be financed through the Delaware Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan Fund, Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, State of Delaware and all provisions shall apply. The conditions of the CWSRF loan govern the requirements for this contract. The Project must comply with federal Davis-Bacon wage rates, Delaware State Prevailing Wages, American Iron and Steel (AIS) requirements, and the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) policy, which are included within the Bidding Documents.

Bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope and shall be marked clearly in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders. Requirements for a 5% Bid Bond, 100% Performance Bond and 100% Payment Bond are included in the Contract Documents.

Each Bidder must deposit with his Bid, security in the amount, form and subject to the conditions provided in the Instruction for Bidders. The City of Rehoboth Beach reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and make such award as appears most advantageous to the City.
