SUBJECT: Planning Commission Report to the Board Of Commissioners

(for the Commissioner's Friday, April 15, 2016 meeting)

A meeting of the Planning Commission was held on Friday, April 8, 2016 from 3:00 PM to 5:30 p.m.

The Commission members in attendance were: Paull Hubbard, Jan Konesey, Joyce Lussier, Francis Markert, David Mellen, Bran Patterson, Michael Strange (arrived at 3:25 p.m.)

Also in attendance: Dam Molina, Building and Licensing

Glenn Mandalas, City Solicitor Elizabeth Lingo, City Arborist

1. Following a report by the Chief Building Inspector that all conditions set forth by the Planning Commission on the matter of the Partitioning Application No. 1015-03 for the property located at 300 Bayard Avenue (Lot Nos. 13, 14, 15 & 16), Block 30, into two (2) lots with Lot Nos. 13 & 14 becoming one (1) lot of 5,010 square feet and Lot Nos. 15 & 16 becoming one (1) lot of 6,969 square feet have been met, the Planning Commission voted to give final approval to the partitioning. The partitioning had been requested by Jeffrey M. Garrison of Garrison Homes LLC on behalf of Joseph A. Mathews, Executor of Nancy E. Mathews Estate, owner of the property. (Vote: Unanimous)

The City Solicitor will notify the applicants of the action taken by the Planning Commission.

- 2. At the suggestion of Commissioner Sharp, the Planning Commission, the newly appointed City Arborist and the Chief Building Inspector reviewed the proposed Draft Tree Ordinance which had been previously submitted to the Mayor and Commissioners in August 2014. A number of suggestions were made by the Arborist and the Building Inspector that would improve the clarity of the proposed draft and would also strengthen a number of points. The Planning Commission is working on incorporating those suggestions into the draft document and hopes to have the upgrade completed for review and approval at its May meeting.
- 3. At this time there are no new partitioning requests that have been submitted. The Planning Commission will schedule its next regular meeting for May 12, 2016. This meeting will commence at 3:00 p.m.

Planning Commission Chairman David Mellen will attend and present the Planning Commission's report and is prepared to answer any questions that the Board of Commissioners may have concerning this report or other activities of the Commission.
