**THE CITY OF REHOBOTH BEACH**  
**FIFTH MODIFICATION TO**  
**PROCLAMATION OF CIVIL EMERGENCY**  
**AND**  
**ORDER CONCERNING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC**

**WHEREAS**, on March 12, 2020 at 3:00 p.m., the Governor of the State of Delaware issued a State of Emergency due to the public health threat of COVID-19, which became effective as of 8:00 a.m. on March 13, 2020 (the “COVID-19 State of Emergency”);

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 22-3 of the Municipal Code of the City of Rehoboth, on March 22, 2020, former City of Rehoboth Beach Mayor Kuhns proclaimed a civil emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic (“Civil Emergency Proclamation”);

**WHEREAS**, the former Mayor implemented an Amended First Modification to the Civil Emergency on May 15, 2020;

**WHEREAS**, the former Mayor implemented a Second Modification to the Civil Emergency on July 1, 2020;

**WHEREAS**, the former Mayor implemented a Third Modification to the Civil Emergency on July 7, 2020;

**WHEREAS**, the former Mayor implemented a Fourth Modification to the Civil Emergency on July 22, 2020;

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Rehoboth Beach desire to revise the Third Modification to the Civil Emergency to provide that face covering requirements shall be consistent with Governor Carney’s Twenty-Seventh Modification to the State of Emergency Declaration;

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Rehoboth Beach desire to revise the Fourth Modification to the Civil Emergency to provide that “Meterless Mondays” shall be extended until and including September 19, 2021;

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Rehoboth Beach desire to extend the policy concerning outdoor dining and merchandise racks on public and private property privileges until and including October 31, 2021;


WHEREAS, the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Rehoboth Beach convened a public meeting on May 11, 2021 to consider measures relating to the COVID-19 State of Emergency to be implemented within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STANLEY A. MILLS JR., Mayor of the City of Rehoboth Beach, Delaware, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Municipal Code of the City of Rehoboth Beach, do hereby **ORDER** this Fifth Modification to the Proclamation of Civil Emergency and Order Concerning the COVID-19 Pandemic issued on March 22, 2020, as follows:

1. The Third Modification to the Civil Emergency implemented on July 7, 2020, addressing restrictions specific to face coverings in the City of Rehoboth Beach, is hereby repealed.
2. Face covering requirements within the City of Rehoboth Beach shall be consistent with Governor Carney's Twenty-Seventh Modification to the State of Emergency Declaration.
3. Parking meter fees established in Section 92-73 of the Municipal Code of the City of Rehoboth Beach shall be suspended on each Monday from 4:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. through the 2021 parking meter season, ending on Sunday, September 19, 2021.
4. The City's policy concerning outdoor dining and merchandise racks on public and private property privileges shall be extended until and including October 31, 2021.
5. This Fifth Modification to the March 22, 2020 Proclamation of Civil Emergency consolidates the entirety of the Proclamation of Civil Emergency. To the extent any provision of the Civil Emergency Proclamation or the First through Fourth Modifications thereto are inconsistent with this Fifth Modification, such provision is hereby repealed.
6. This Order has the force and effect of law and may be enforced in accordance with Section 22-11 of the City of Rehoboth Beach Municipal Code.
7. This Fifth Modification to the March 22, 2020 Proclamation of Civil Emergency and Order shall take effect immediately upon the Mayor's execution.
